In Venezuela, the tally of dead and injured protesters grows daily after weeks of demonstrations against economic ruin and autocratic rule. Even when bombarded with tear gas and water cannons, he plays on; his quest is to create an atmosphere of hope amid the turmoil and repression. Wully's iconic form of peaceful resistance has become a global media sensation, helping show the world that Venezuelans are fighting for their freedom.
